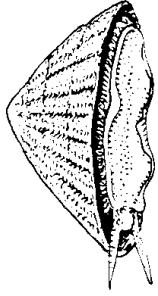

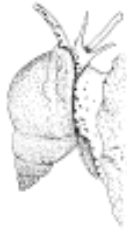

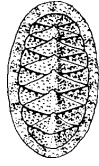

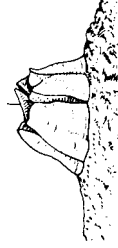

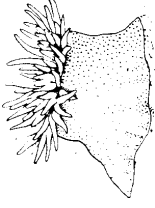

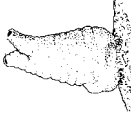

Beadlet anemone (up to 6 cm)

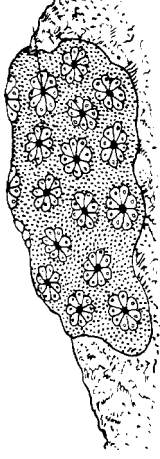


Grey sea slug (up to 8 cm)

Sea lemon (up to 7 cm)



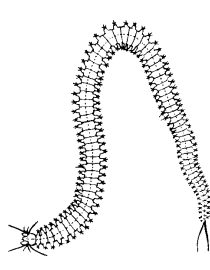
Sea squirt colony (size varies)

Breadcrumb sponge (colony to 20 cm)

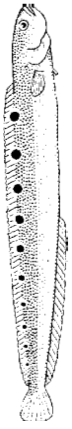


Ragworm (up to 12 cm)

Flatfish (young - up to 10 cm)



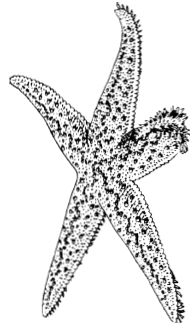

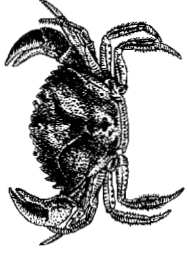
